Summary (11/2)

Tonight we heard from Dr. Kober and a few other members of the national pork board. Dr. Kober is a swine veterinarian from here in West Michigan. Dr. Kober is an alumnus of Michigan State College of Veterinary medicine. We also heard from Kayla, a student at South Dakota State University. She is a senior majoring in animal science. She works in the pig barn on campus. She described the procedure to enter the farm and why pigs are in a farm. We also got to see the barn and the enclosures of the pigs. Dr.Kober explained the importance and roles of a swine veterinarian. Swine veterinarians maintain healthy pigs by vaccinating and maintaining a clean environment. They also identify, treat, and control diseases that pigs may come in contact with. Dr. Kober also talked about other things that veterinarians and other people involved in food production need to take precaution of. One of which is antibiotic residue, they try not to have any antibiotic residue in any food products. Emily, a member of the national pork board also mentioned the progress of swine production and their advancements in technologies. Dr. Kober also mentioned an opportunity to join the American Association of Swine veterinarians. Students pursuing a DVM are welcome to join. This is good to keep in mind for those who are interested in swine medicine once you are in veterinary school.
