Paws with a cause is an organization located in Wayland, Michigan that provides service dogs for people with mobility issues, hard of hearing, seizures, and kids with autism. The organization breeds, trains, and takes care of veterinary services for the service dogs. Dr.Homann was able to give an inside look of what it is
